ADELANTE STUDENT VOICES \$15,000

Poughkeepsie, New York

To support its organizing among undocumented students, particularly its effort to support undocumented youth in K-12 grades in rural school districts who face neglect and discrimination.

PHILADELPHIA JOBS WITH JUSTICE \$12,000

Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

To support its efforts to change Philadelphia public policy affecting workers and to engage in an effort to organize Amazon workers to act on their own behalf to deal with their workplace issues.

WISCONSIN NATIVE VOTE \$12,000

Madison, Wisconsin

To support the engagement of Wisconsin Conservation Voices with Wisconsin Tribes and their partnership efforts to advance policies in support of clean energy, clean water, and democracy and the practice of civic and electoral participation.

MICHIGAN FAITH IN ACTION \$12,000

Flint, Michigan To support its strategy to expand its organizing statewide, building upon its experience organizing to confront the 2014 Flint water crisis. Its focus will be criminal justice and electoral participation.

THE PEOPLE'S PORT AUTHORITY \$15,000

Providence, Rhode Island

To support its organizing to confront the polluters and government decision-makers who are not doing enough to deal with the environmental pollution and toxic emissions that have plagued their neighborhoods for generations.

Bowling Green, Ohio

ALIANZA AGRICOLA \$12,000

Geneseo, New York To support this emerging farmworker organizing effort in upstate New York, particularly to be involved in state policy campaigns to advance immigrant and farmworker rights.
